Myers' Musings Thanksgiving 2024

"Let us give thanks in all circumstances." . . . I Thess. 5:18

Dear members and friends,

One Thanksgiving season a family was seated around their table, looking at the annual holiday bird. From the oldest to the youngest, every member of the family was to express their praise. When they came to the 5-year-old in the family, he began by looking at the turkey and expressing his thanks to the turkey, saying although he had not tasted it, he knew it would be good. After that rather novel expression of thanksgiving, he began with a more predictable line of credits, thanking his mother for cooking the turkey and his father for buying the turkey. But then he went beyond that. He joined together a whole hidden multitude of benefactors, linking them with cause and effect. He said, "I thank you for the checker at the grocery store who checked out the turkey." "I thank you for the grocery store people who put it on the shelf." "I thank you for the farmer who made it fat." "I thank you for the man who made the feed." "I thank you for those who brought the turkey to the store."

Using his Columbo-like little mind, he traced the turkey all the way from its origin to his plate. And then at the end he solemnly

said, "Did I leave anybody out?"

His 4-year-older brother, embarrassed by all those proceedings, said, "God."

Solemnly and without being flustered at all, the 5-year-old said, "I was about to get to Him."

But wait a minute! The 5-year-old did remember God - kind of. Who was the "you" he kept thanking, if not God? Isn't that the way it is for all of us sometimes? Sometimes we include God, but almost as an afterthought. 
FROM THE GOVERNANCE TEAM:

Thank you to everyone who gave us feedback on our ideas for rightsizing committee structure. At the recent listening sessions, we heard very little dissent about forming 5 teams to replace our existing committee structure and even some excitement! The main concerns have been making sure that all tasks are covered by at least one team and that we maintain institutional memory, so that "wheels don't need to be reinvented" when people change. These are not obstacles to making the change, just important items to remember. Another concern has been about team labels, which we can change.

Thus, the governance team will propose that the church council consider the possibility of amending the portion of our bylaws relating to committees for the coming year. If the council agrees, they will recommend to the congregation a vote of approval at the annual meeting scheduled in January. In addition, we will also work with the council to provide for the congregation's vote a slate of officers and team co-chairs, people who agreed to serve in their respective positions for one year. Officers would include a president, a treasurer, a clerk, a secretary/vice-president; the rest of next year's council would be a pair of team co-chairs for each of the 5 teams. (Only one co-chair would be required to attend council meetings, although both would be welcome if they want!) If the congregation approves the change in committee structure and the slate of council members, then over the course of 2025 the governance team would continue to assess whether any other changes are needed to the by-laws and work towards presenting another revision for a vote in 2026. The pace may seem slow, but we want to be careful not to lose any of the features that make our church what it is today.

Worship Information, November 2024

November 3:

All Saints Sunday, The Sacrament of Communion: **Sermon**: "The Foundation of the Saints" based on Selections from Hebrews, Chapters 11 and 12.

This morning, we will remember the saints by ringing a chime when

their name is read. These persons have been, in some way, affiliated with this church who have died in the past year. But we also will take note that in many ways we all are saints. William Willimon defined a saint this way: "A person is properly designated a saint, not when that person succeeds in living a strenuously virtual life, but whenever God commandeers that's person life, whenever that person embodies, at least to some degree, what God really wants for that person's life, here, now."

November 10:

Sermon: "From Arithmetic to Love" based on: Ecclesiastes 3:1 – 8 and Mark 14:3 – 9.

Things can get confusing when trying to be faithful following Jesus. Oon the one hand he tells a scribe to sell all he has and give it to the poor, and today in Mark's story he praises as woman who comes in with the most expensive perfume and anoints him with it. What a seeming waste of money? But, like in the book of Ecclesiastes maybe there is a time for everything. For sometimes Jesus lifts us clear out arithmetic and into love!

November 17:

Sermon: "What?!? Me Worry?!? based on: Matthew 6:24 – 33. Many of you will remember Alfred E. Newman from Mad Magazine that was meant to be satirical commentary on our culture. He was the deadbeat hippie, who acted as if he didn't have a care in the world. Let's take a look at Jesus admonition not to worry, and see if it can help us in our daily stresses of life.

November 24

Thanksgiving Sunday: Sermon: "Can Rotting Broccoli Ever Be Holy?" based on: Habakkuk 3: 17 - 19a.

Thanksgiving is close. And while it is an opportunity for us all to "count our blessings," I know that for some of you are having a tough time this year when hardship, death and loss has overwhelmed your life. Let is remember that the first Thanksgiving in Plimouth, MA came out of gratitude that half of original 101 "pilgrims" (would they be called illegal aliens today?) were still surviving after a very difficult winter.

We will also celebrate receiving your faithful pledges of your "Prayers," "Presence," "Gifts," and "Service."

December 1:

First Sunday of Advent. Communion. Sermon: "Preparing" based on Mark 13:24 – 27 and Mark 4:30 –32.

Advent is the Church season of the year that begins a new cycle of covering the life and seasons of Jesus. And like expectant parents, we have some time to prepare. But for what? In the Hebrew tradition you would only know that the Messiah had come by seeing the "signs of the Messiah". What are those signs? When John the Baptist was imprisoned before being beheaded wanted to know if indeed Jesus had come; and Jesus told his disciples to go and tell John: "The blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them."

- · Had all the carpets, except the Sanctuary, cleaned.
- · Had the gutters cleaned out and repaired.
- · Installed several new thermostats.
- · Performed a financial audit.
- · Sanded and painted a new non-skid surface on all ramps.
- Entered into a new and lower cost copier contract.
- · Repaired carpet at side entrance.
- · Had the elevator inspected.
- · Repaired stains on Sunday School ceiling.
- · Replaced the basement windows.
- · Repaired basement entry door.
- · Coordinated at all Church briefing from our investment advisor.
- Repaired siding and painted failing paint on the Courthouse side of the Church.
- Had the chimney rebuilt and a new cap installed.
- · Fixed a dangerous hole at the side entry ramp.

- Managed our endowment and received and trained a newtreasurer.
